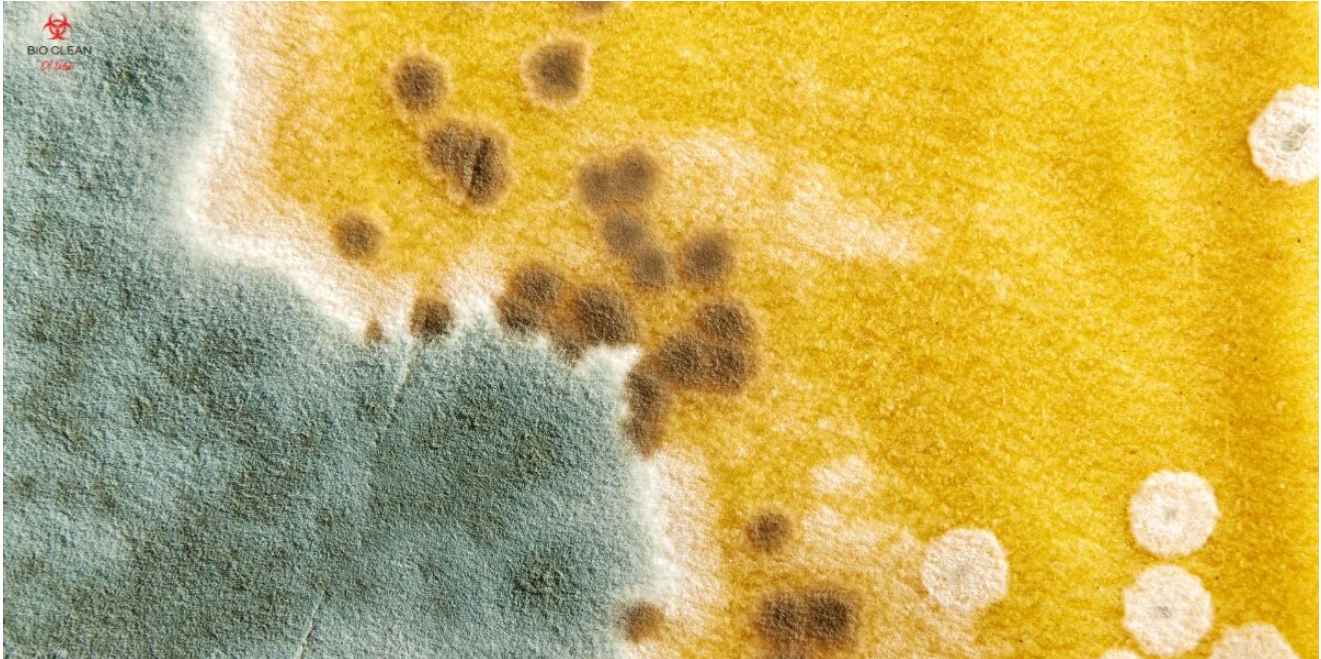


Black Mold VS Mildew: Know the Difference to Safeguard Your Utah Home
